<u>Goals</u>

- 1. **Educate our membership** by having seminars to reinforce the principles of our organization:
 - a. We are constantly being met with an ever-changing world; as Master Masons we must make changes while maintaining our Protocol, Ritual and Constitution. The proper maintenance of the aforementioned items encourages us to work in harmony thereby helping us to demonstrate to ourselves and the world how masons love one another.

- 2. Introduce **new ways to display our organization** to our membership and the community at large:
 - a. Our masonic website must be updated and streamlined to resemble the world in which we live. The website can be used to educate our membership in areas of our History, Finances, Leadership, etc. We can also exhibit our concern for our community and broaden our perspective not only jurisdictionally but also on the national level by instituting programs that help the community.
- 3. **Establish a Capital Budget:** to offset the cost our Building Renovations that are related to our aging infrastructure: heating system, windows doors, etc.
 - a. I will be asking all masons as well as members of the Prince Hall Family to contribute donations to our Grand Lodge **Building Fund Grants Program** which will be used only for our Building Maintenance. The monies that we receive now in Temple Association will not meet our future needs; especially if we have a major maintenance problem in any of our buildings.
- 4. Obtain, Retain, and Reclaim membership:
 - a. We must ensure our subordinate houses are prepared to receive membership. The state of readiness we hope for is one that entails administrative, fiscal, constitutional, ritualistic, and social awareness within our subordinate lodges, as well as our Grand Lodge. We must be aware of situations which cause brothers to leave our fraternity to prevent their reoccurrence. We must also explore areas of our jurisdiction where a lodge or lodges previously existed but no longer function.

5. <u>Charity</u>

a. **Juvenile Diabetes**: or Type 1 diabetes typically affects younger individuals. Type 1 diabetes begins before the age of 40, although there have been people diagnosed at an older age. In the United States, the peak age at diagnosis is around 14. Children can also have type 2 diabetes if they are overweight. More information will be forwarded in the near future.

6. Restructuring Program:

a. This program, currently in effect by our Grand Lodge, will remain a part of this administration. The structure of our Grand Lodge must accommodate changes in membership, increased fiscal responsibility and aging infrastructure. I will seek persons within/ without our fraternity to help us reach our desired goal.
